MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT



Dear Cherry Hills Members:

As our Membership is well aware, it has been a busy winter at Cherry Hills Country Club. There have been some significant projects that have been ongoing, and I want to update you on those as well as some other happenings.

With the results of the Membership Survey now in hand, the Club's Board will be focusing on the next

steps for the potential improvements and changes to our Clubhouse facilities. The primary areas of focus for the Board are the south end of the Clubhouse and the adjacent pool. Other parts of the facility and additional enhancements are still

being considered as well, but the vast majority of the capital spent on any potential project would be allocated to the Clubhouse.

The "south end" portion of the Clubhouse has essentially been untouched since the 1960's. One of the questions we have been asked is what, exactly, does the south end include? The south end includes everything from the Founders Room all the way to the end of the building by the pool. Within the south end are the rooms our Members usually see such as the Founders Room, Presidents Room, and Ballroom. However, the majority of the south end square footage is actually in areas our Members don't see. In addition to the gathering spaces on the main floor are also our service delivery and pickup, the terrace patio overlooking the pool, all refrigerated food storage, and our kitchen. In the basement is storage for furniture and other items, employee offices, staff locker room and break room areas, the kidZone, restrooms, and many areas of operations such as laundry and some of our heating, air ventilation, and cooling equipment. Also in the basement are the storage for all of our liquor, beverages, dry goods, and dining operations. Upstairs on the second floor are additional offices, the employee conference room, storage for seasonal decorations, and climate controlled storage of the Club's archives and historic items not on display throughout the Clubhouse.

The next steps for the Board start with outlining the scope of the improvements we will put forth in a final proposal. To have a final proposal ready for the Membership, we are updating the cost of each area under consideration and reevaluating all the financial planning. Not only finalizing the structure of a capital plan to pay for the potential improvements, but also the impact of those facilities on our annual operating costs. Numerous committees, staff, and Members are working on each of these aspects right now.

It is our intention to publish a detailed timeline of the next steps in April. Before any vote takes place, our Members will have plenty of notice and Member meetings will be held to address exactly what is being proposed.

Over the winter the Board also completed the search for our new General Manager, ultimately hiring Thorsten Loth. We are eager for him to

arrive and start what we hope is a tremendously successful tenure at our



Club. Originally, we announced Thorsten would start on May 1st. Thanks to some convenient circumstances, Thorsten's

start date has been moved up to April 10th. On the evening of Thursday, May 18th, at 6pm the Club will have an Open House for the Members to meet and welcome Thorsten. You will receive an invitation with the details soon.

Cherry Hills Country Club hosted the Western Golf Association's Colorado meetings in January. It would be difficult to overstate the appreciation and gratitude the WGA expressed for the support our Membership has shown for the Evans Scholarship program. Our Memberships' tremendous support of the Evans Scholarship program is truly unparalleled. As a result of that support and our caddie program's success in attracting outstanding young men and women, three more deserving Cherry Hills caddies received a full four-year room, board, and tuition scholarship to the University of Colorado. Thank you for continuing to support the Cherry Hills Par Club and our caddie program.

In closing, I would like to thank our Membership for the candid, respectful, and open discussions we have had about the long-range plan over the past few months. In talking with many of our long-tenured Members the past few months, I am reminded of the dedication that has gone into developing this property and maintaining the tremendous reputation and prestige that Cherry Hills Country Club enjoys today. It is truly an honor to be a member of our Club, and I am very thankful for the opportunity to be your President. I look forward to your continued friendship and counsel as I serve the Membership of this great Club.

Dennis Ralston, 1963 Davis Cup Tennis Legend, visits Cherry Hills

Mr. Jerry Berglund, a former ball-boy along with Mr. Buz Koelbel at the 1963 Davis Cup event held at Cherry Hills, graciously hosted Dennis Ralston to the Club this past January. Mr. Ralston was in town for his induction into the Colorado Tennis Hall of Fame, and he wanted to re-visit one of his fondest memories in his storied playing and coaching career. Mr. Ralston was one of the top players for the U.S. in 1963 which also featured the debut of Arthur Ashe. He shared some wonderful (and very detailed) stories regarding that historical September 13-15th weekend at Cherry Hills. He spoke very highly of Cherry Hills and the fantastic support of all our Members. Mr. Ralston vividly recalled his early morning wake-up call from Coach/Captain Pancho

Gonzalez after "an amazing" Cherry Hills Davis Cup Party the night before. He assumed he was not going to play since they had clinched the overall match, but Pancho said otherwise. He had never experienced the high altitude mixed with "quite a few beers" the night before and proceeded to go out the next morning and play one of the longest sets of his career which he won 18-16. He won the match, but said he learned his lesson! The U.S. went on to win the Davis Cup that year defeating Australia in the finals on the grass courts in Adelaide. Mr. Ralston defeated Australian legend John Newcombe in a five-set thriller to help the U.S. secure a 3-2 victory.


